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The Grand Palace and Temple of the Emerald Buddha



When King Buddha Yodfa Chulaloke the great (King Rama I) ascended the throne and established Rattanakosin as the nation's new capital east of the Chao phraya river in 1782, he ordered construction of the Temple of the Emerald Buddha to enshrine the Emerald Buddha (Phra Phuttha Maha Mani Rattana Patimakon) and construction of the Grand Palace as the royal residence for monarchs of the Chakri Dynasty. Throughout the reign of each king, been there have renovations additional Thawornwatthu(permanent structures) as deemed appropriate in each period only to enhance its majestic as can be witnessed today.


Opening hours: Every day from 08:30 am. - 15:30 pm. Tel: 02 623 5500
