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Khao San Road




Khao San Road was built in 1892 in the reign of king Rama V. The Department of Public Works received Royal permission to build the road from Chana Songkhram Temple. The road was named as "Khoa San Road" by King Rama V. In the reign of King Rama V. The road became a center of rice trading in Bangkok. Rice from the Royal barn near Chang Rong Si Bridge on the old moat was brought to trade there. Khao San Road has been a popular site among foreign tourists to celebrate the Songkran Festival since 1990 and the numbers of guesthouses have been built to accommodate foreign tourists

Opening Hours: Every day and 24 hours.

How to get here:

- 1. Take express boat from Wang Lang Pier to Phra Arthit pier (express boat cost 15 Baht)
- 2. Continue walk around 5 minutes and you will find Khao San Road.
