

Wat Arun



Wat Arun Ratchawaram Ratchawaramahawihan or Wat Arun is a Buddhist temple in Bangkok Yai district of Bangkok, Thailand, on the Thonburi west bank of the Chao Phraya River. The temple derives its name from the Hindu god Aruna often personified as the radiations of the rising sun. Wat Arun is among the best known of Thailand's landmarks and the first light of the morning reflects off the surface of the temple with pearly iridescence. Although the temple had existed since at least the seventeenth century, its distinctive prang (spires) were built in the early nineteenth century during the reign of King Rama II.

1. Walk from Baan Wanglang Riverside to Arun Ammarin 18.
2. Continue straight around 1.7 Km. You will find Wat Arun or can take taxi Arun Ammarin 18 around 50 Baht.
