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Wat Rakang Kositaram Woramahawihan




This ancient temple of the 2nd Royal during Woramahawihan Class was originally built Ayutthaya period and was first named "Wat Bangwa Yai". And a bell was unearthed. Since the bell had a particularly melodic sound, it was brought to the Temple of Emerald Buddha and five new bells were created to replace it. The temple was royally bestowed with its new name "Wat Rakang Kositaram" (Temple of the Bells.) There are many attractions inside the temple such as the Ubosoth Chapel with the principal Buddha's statue name "Smile Buddha", the building in which the Holy Scriptures are kept has stunning architecture and was once a residence of King Buddha Yodfa Chulalok the great when he performed administrative duties in Thonburi period.
